Dr. Lisa Archibald

Lisa Archibald worked as a clinical Speech-Language Pathologist (SLP) for over 15 years providing services to children and adults, in schools, hospitals, and other facilities. Currently Professor and Director in the School of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the University of Western Ontario, Lisa studies links between memory and language processes in individuals with communication disorders. Lisa's work has also focused on SI Peducator school-based collaborations. She was part of an international team of researchers and others considering terminology and profile for children with an unexplained, persistent language disorder now known as developmental language disorder (DLD).



As a former member of the international committee of RADLD.org and a founding member of DLDandMe, Lisa has been active in advocacy campaigns for DLD. Recently, Lisa developed The DLD Toolbox, an online resource for SLPs to support diagnostic decisions regarding DLD.

Dr. Bill Hodgetts

Bill Hodgetts, PhD, R.Aud. is a Professor in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at the university of Alberta and Program Director for Audiology and Bone Conduction Amplification at the Institute for **Reconstructive Sciences in** Medicine (IRSM). With a background in psychology, clinical audiology, and rehabilitation sciences. his work sits at an intersection of hearing technology and human behavior. Bill's research focuses on improving outcomes with bone conduction devices through better assessment, prescription, and verification methods - most notably via the DSL-BCD framework. He also explores the psychological and identityrelated barriers that shape how people engage (or don't) with hearing care



Whether he's designing tools to make hearing more coherent or reimagining what it means to "help", Bill is passionate about bridging science, story, and realworld care.
